


ZCSD Has Proven to be Efficient and Responsible with its Funding Doing More with Less

- ZCSD relies more heavily on state funding than most nearby school districts
- ZCSD has the lowest per student expenditure amounts in the region and state
- ZCSD spends much less per student than other districts, with very strong results
- ZCSD focuses spending on instruction vs. administration

State Funding Values Lessened While Investments in Students Rose





SALARIES ROSE BY 13% BUYING POWER DROPPED BY 32%







ZCSD Current Revenues and Expenditures 24-25 SY






ZCSD Current Millages (Property Taxes)

ZCSD Total Millages By Year




Household Cost of School Millages in 2025



Re-allocation of Existing Millage


November 15 Tax Election

- ZCSB approved proposition
- If passed, homeowner millage rates would stay the same as 2026 through next 20 years
- Proposition allows ZCSD to maintain excellence by using funding to pay off existing facility bonds while also:
 - Strengthening employee compensation packages
 - Supporting technology improvements
 - Assuring facility maintenance over time to keep Zachary schools strong




How Does this Impact Tax Bills?


2025 Millage Rates Supporting ZCSD

Bond Payments vs Available Revenue Over Time




Plan B What if the November Proposition Fails?



Prioritize as competitive as possible employee compensation to maintain quality staffing

What could this mean?

- Departmental or programmatic cuts
- Tighter benefit packages
- Class size adjustments
- Transportation adjustments
- Increased fees for certain activities (tutoring, dual enrollment, clubs, extracurriculars)
- Technology fees
- Deferred maintenance on facilities or relying on reserve funding
